ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR FOR PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATIONS

According to the order number No. D-11011/500/2024-Academic Cell Government of India National Medical Commission. Guidelines for Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) Curriculum - 2024

The performance in essential components of training is to be assessed, based on following three components:

1. Attendance - There shall be a minimum of 75% attendance in theory and 80% attendance in practical /clinical for eligibility to appear for the examinations in that subject.

2. Internal Assessment (IA)

- There shall be no less than three theory and practical internal assessment examinations in each phase 1 &II subject, and this mandatorily includes pre-university examination. There shall be no less than two theory and clinical examinations in each subject of Phase III, part 1 & 2, and this mandatorily includes an end-of-posting assessment.
- Learners must secure at least 50% of the total marks (combined in theory and practical/clinical; and minimum 40% in theory and practical separately) for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible to appear for appearing at the final University examination of that subject.
- 3. Completed the logbook appropriate for that phase of training to be eligible to appear at the final university and also certifiable competencies in clinical subjects.

Remedial measures:

A student who has deficiency(s) in any of the 3 criteria that are required to be eligible to appear in university examination should be put into the remedial process as below:

- During the course: If Internal assessment (IA) or attendance is less or/and certifiable competencies not achieved and marked in log book in quarterly/ six monthly monitoring, the students/parents must be intimated about the possibility of being detained much before the final university examination, so that there is sufficient time for remedial measures.
- At the end of the phase: If Internal assessment (IA) or attendance is less than or/and certifiable competencies not achieved and marked in the log book at the end of regular classes in a phase, the student is detained to appear in the regular university examination of that batch.
- Remedial classes can be planned for students missing regular classes on genuine grounds, thus ensuring that all certifiable competencies are achieved.

***In spite of all the above measures, if the student is still not meeting the criteria to be eligible for a regular exam, he shall be offered remedial for the same batch supplementary exam. For attendance, he will be allowed remedial measures ONLY IF attendance is more than 60% for each component. 19/4/05
